

Tigers Sweep 3 Game Series

Andrew College scored runs in each of the first four innings on their way to a win in their first conference game of the season. Aaron West earned his fourth win in the opener, going 6 innings and only allowing a single run on five hits. Andrew jumped out to an early lead scoring 5 runs in the first inning sending every Tiger batter to the plate. In the second, Ric Bishop parked his second home run of the season, sending a low line drive over the right field fence to give Andrew a 6-0 lead. The Tigers added 1 run in the third and 4 more in the fourth using back to back RBI hits by Zach Martin and Casey Townsend to cap off the scoring. Chase Hargraves worked the seventh to record the final 3 outs of the game. Andrew was led offensively by Adam Fuller who had 3 hits and 2 runs scored. Ric Bishop, Brian Stewart, Zach Martin, and Merit Hicks all added two hits each.

In the second game Andrew College used a dominant performance by Kenny Faulk to secure the doubleheader sweep on Saturday. Faulk was nearly unhittable going 6 innings only allowing two hits and striking out nine on his way to his third win of the season. The Tiger bats were held in check with the offense only producing 5 hits in the nightcap. Carson Tate led the way picking up two hits to go along with his 3 RBIs. Zach Martin, Merit Hicks, and Jud Jones had the other three hits for the Tigers. Chris McKenna worked the seventh to collect his fourth save of the season.

Andrew College finished the three game sweep on Sunday. RM Cozza threw five innings striking out three en route to his third win of the season. The Tigers offense pounded out eighteen hits on the day. Eleven Tigers collected hits on the day with the highlight being Zach Martin who collected 3 hits and 7 RBIs, including his second homerun of the season. His three run blast off of the scoreboard in right field capped off an eight run fifth inning. Joe Sutton, Adam Fuller, Ric Bishop, Casey Townsend, and Carson Tate all added two hits on the day. Jacob Watson pitched the sixth, seventh, and eighth innings recording 4 strikeouts. Marcus Luton got the final three outs, including a strikeout of his own. The Tigers improved their overall record to 15-5. The Tigers moved themselves into first place in conference play after the first weekend of conference action. The Tigers will host Okaloosa-Walton on Monday, and host Darton next weekend.
