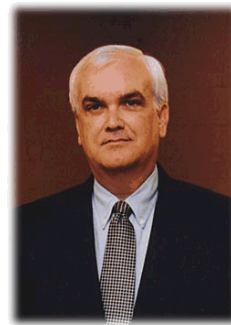

Andrew College Board Elects Seyle 21st President

CUTHBERT, GA, August 9, 2007— David C. Seyle has been unanimously elected the 21st president of Andrew College.

Meeting yesterday in a specially called board meeting, Andrew's Board of Trustees approved the recommendation of its 8-member Executive Committee that Seyle, currently the interim president, become Andrew's next leader.

Emily Jean McAfee, chairman of the Andrew board, said, "The Trustees and I appreciate the strong leadership David Seyle provided during the academic year, are aware of his successes both on and off campus, and look forward to his leadership bringing Andrew to new levels of meeting our vision."

During the 2006-07 academic year, Andrew enjoyed an increase in freshman enrollment and faculty and staff. Andrew had a successful fundraising campaign that made possible a 4% bonus for faculty and staff, a balanced budget, and a reduction in College debt. The endowment grew by \$1.7 million, and gifts and pledges totaling \$650,000 were secured to address deferred maintenance. Seyle led Andrew to successful reaccreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in 2007.

Seyle and Claudia, his wife, came to Andrew in 1991. He was appointed Chaplain of Andrew College and the Pastor of the Cuthbert United Methodist Church. He accepted the post of Dean of the College and Professor of Religion and Philosophy in 1995. As a member of the faculty, Seyle authored a Georgia Humanities Council Grant. He also authored a grant to the Joseph E. Mertz Memorial Foundation that led to Andrew's current and unique Servant Leadership Program funded by the Bradley-Turner Foundation. Seyle currently is the Chair of the Committee on Colleges of the Georgia United Methodist Commission on Higher Education and Campus Ministry.

Mrs. Claudia Seyle holds an M.A. in Humanities from Florida State University, where she specialized in Renaissance Art, and is currently Associate Professor of Humanities at Andrew. She has served Andrew for 16 years, and besides teaching a variety of academic classes, she is currently leading the effort to revitalize the campus grounds.

"Claudia and I love Andrew and Cuthbert. We have since we arrived in 1991. I'm so very grateful to the Trustees for allowing us the opportunity to add our commitment to Andrew to that of the twenty who have previously led this vibrant and positive campus community," commented Seyle.

Founded in 1854, Andrew College is a small, two-year, residential college related to The United Methodist Church. Its mission is to provide an academically challenging liberal arts curriculum within a nurturing community. In keeping with its Christian heritage, Andrew is committed to providing students with the resources and guidance to move ahead, to finish college and enable them to understand themselves as persons of responsibility and potential within the global community.
