Ryan Dean begins his second season as the Andrew College assistant baseball coach. Dean is currently attending Columbus State University to earn a degree in Math Education. A native of Columbus, Georgia, Dean comes to Andrew after spending last season as the assistant coach at Columbus High School. He became the first player/coach in school history to win state championships both as a player and a coach at Columbus High.

Dean is a graduate of Columbus High School where he played for a Georgia State High School Championship baseball team under legendary coach Bobby Howard. Dean enjoyed a fruitful athletic career at Columbus High, where he was named to the First Team All Bi-City Team twice along with Team Georgia twice. After two years at Middle Georgia, Coach Dean had two major injuries that derailed his career and forced him to leave the game earlier than expected.
