The Andrew Commitment

Andrew College, in Cuthbert, Georgia, is making a financial commitment to its students in this time of economic distress. Current students who return in the fall will not have an increase in tuition, room, board and fees. New incoming students will pay the same tuition, room, board and fees for both years that they attend Andrew College.

Bridget Kurkowski, Director of Admission, states, "Andrew College has always made it a priority to financially assist students who want to achieve an Associate's Degree. *The Andrew Commitment* demonstrates to our students and their families that Andrew is sympathetic to the added financial pressures on them. Andrew wants to do all that we can do to help relieve that stress."

Founded in 1854, Andrew College is a private, two-year, residential, liberal arts college related to The United Methodist Church. Its mission is to provide an academically challenging liberal arts curriculum within a nurturing community. The charter of Andrew, granted in 1854 by the Georgia Legislature, is the second oldest charter in the U.S. giving an educational institution the right to confer degrees upon women. In 1956, the institution became co-educational. Only a handful of colleges in Georgia are older than Andrew and few possess such a rich and celebrated history.
