Andrew College Appoints New Dean of Students

CUTHBERT, GA, February 11, 2008—Andrew College is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Sherri Knight Taylor to the position of Dean of Students on February 1, 2008.

Dr. Taylor has been a member of the Andrew family since 2002 when she joined Andrew College as the Director of the Focus Program and Associate Professor of Psychology. In 2006, Dr. Taylor was honored as the first recipient of the James H. Woodall, Jr. Award for Excellence in Teaching at Andrew College. Dr. Taylor will continue to provide supervision and direction for the Focus Program and teach in the psychology department in her new role as Dean of Students.

Dr. Taylor and her husband, Pat, came to Cuthbert in 2002 from Eufaula, Alabama. Before coming to Andrew College and Cuthbert, she was employed at Wallace Community College-Sparks Campus in Eufaula. While in Eufaula, Dr. Taylor was recognized as the 2000 Eufaula/Barbour County Chamber of Commerce Volunteer of the Year and named a Citizen of the Year by the Eufaula Tribune in 2000. Dr. Taylor was also an International Rotary Professional Group Study Exchange Team Member to Japan in 1999.

Dr. Taylor received her baccalaureate degree in psychology from Auburn University, and her master degree in counseling psychology from Troy University. Most recently, Taylor received her doctoral degree from Nova Southeastern University in February 2006.

“I am very excited to be called upon to serve as Dean of Students at Andrew College,” commented Dr. Taylor. “I look forward to working with the Student Life staff, as well as all the students, staff and faculty here at Andrew. I believe whole heartedly in the mission of Andrew College and deeply appreciate the trust the school has invested in me as Dean of Students.”

When asked about Dr. Taylor’s new position at the College, Dr. David Seyle, President of Andrew College, said, “Dr. Taylor’s varied expertise in higher education and her skills and commitment to Andrew College and its students uniquely equip her for her new role here. We expect the Student Life Department to flourish under her leadership.”
