Andrew College faculty members achieve notable accomplishments

CUTHBERT, GA. -- Molly Gross, professor of English and Farrah Senn, assistant professor of English published the first print version of *Spire Light: A Journal of Creative Expression* featuring student, faculty, and alumni art and literary works. In February, Professor Gross attended a conference for the Association of Writers and Writing Programs (AWP) in Washington D.C.

Professor Gross also wrote a play, *Cuthbert in the Twenties!* The play reflects the people and places of Cuthbert in the Twenties and was performed in Cuthbert on May 19 & 20.

Nate Gross, division coordinator of fine arts and theatre program director directed the play, *Cuthbert in the Twenties!*

Chris Johnson, assistant professor of visual art and director of the visual art program, designed the cover for the Journal of the Georgia Philological Association, volume 6 publication. He also recently completed a mural for the City of Cuthbert. A dedication was held on April 25. The mural is the result of the efforts of the Randolph Arts Council, Randolph Chamber of Commerce and Andrew College in laying the initial ground work, obtaining a Vibrant Communities grant. It took Chris 18 days spread over two months to complete. Professor Johnson is currently working on a mural in Shellman.

David Rhode, associate professor of chemistry, served as a judge at the Darton Science Fair.

Charles Roberts, assistant professor of history, just finished serving as the Book Review Editor for the Alabama Review.

Assistant Professor of English Farrah Senn, served as Editor-in-Chief of volume 6 of the *Journal of the Georgia Philological Association*. She also co-authored an article featured in the edition with Dr. Amanda Allen from Brewton-Parker College entitled, “#Education is Trending: Social Media in the Classroom.”
