### Visual Arts

The Associate of Arts degree in Visual Arts is designed to provide a college-level introduction to

- Drawing
- Painting
- Color & Design
- 2-D Design
- 3-D Design
- Photography
- Art History
- Ceramics

Studio art classes, taught by faculty who are working artists, provide students hands-on experience with traditional methods and mediums as well as contemporary processes and digital media. Students are afforded the opportunity to develop their technical and conceptual skills in the creation of artwork. Through frequent group critiques and individual artwork discussions, students learn to critically analyze what makes some works more successful than others.

Students who choose Andrew College will find that they can express themselves through artistic ideas in a welcoming community.

Students are able to exhibit their work at a college art show each semester.



The **Fine Arts program** serves students at Andrew College who are interested in art, music and theatre.

All fine arts students have many opportunities to create and showcase their artistic, musical and theatrical talents throughout the community and region at festivals, art shows and theatrical productions. A regionally renown art gallery is located just a short driving distance away in Shellman. And, for theatre students needing inspiration, the Springer Theatre, located in Columbus, Georgia, is one of America's most vibrant professional theatre companies.

The curriculum in each program mirrors that of the University System of Georgia, providing a solid foundation and preparing fine arts students to complete the final two years of undergraduate study at a four-year institution. Class sizes average just six to eight students ensuring that students will receive personalized attention tailored to their specific needs.

### Theatre

The Theatre program at Andrew offers an Associate's degree, meaning students are involved in production from day one. The curriculum is designed for ready transfer to four-year programs within the University System of Georgia as well as private colleges and programs inside and outside of the state.

The home for the theatre department is the historic Liddie Murphy Theatre on the Andrew College campus. Seating up to 180, "The Liddie" has welcomed audiences to Andrew for over 120 years. Recent renovations include LED lighting, a digital soundboard, curtains, resurfaced floors and refurbished historic seating. Also, new to our downtown Cuthbert campus, is a set design shop.

The production season includes a fall entry in Region 4 of the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival (KCACTF), providing students the opportunity for feedback from regional representatives as well as nominations to compete for scholarships and awards at Festival. This opportunity is often reserved for upperclassmen in larger programs. In addition to mainstage productions, the program performs an interactive murder mystery and works with local students and community members, as well as in collaboration with Visual Art and Music.

Because the program considers the development of the student its top priority, second year students are taken to the Georgia Theatre Conference to audition and interview for four-year programs. In addition, the program encourages student leadership through its newly reactivated Cast of Delta Psi Omega, the national two-year college theatre honor society as well as its Student Club—A.C.T.



### Theatrical Engagement

Students are able to take part in diverse performances in order to build their high-end theatrical portfolio.

### Music

Andrew College offers an Associate of Music degree with a vocal, piano or instrumental emphasis. Music students will take courses in music theory, aural skills and applied lessons.

Nurturing, yet challenging, the Music department hosts an environment for music students to develop their skills. Participation in performance groups is required for music students, but available to any Andrew College student regardless of academic program.

### Choraliers

The Choraliers is Andrew's premier vocal ensemble. Students participating in the Choraliers hone their choral singing skills while learning and performing a wide repertoire of classical and contemporary pieces.

### Jazz Ensemble

Open to all Andrew College students, the Jazz Ensemble is Andrew's premier instrumental ensemble. Students learn the tradition, styles, and fundamentals of jazz, commercial music and improvisation.

### Voice and Piano Programs

Andrew College provides applied lesson instruction in voice and piano for all voice and piano majors as required for the Associate of Music degree at Andrew as well as for the bachelor's degree programs in music.
