General Function:

Andrew College is seeking an adjunct professor for its Applied Behavioral Health program. The successful applicant must have a master's degree or a Ph. D. in the study of human behavior, behavioral health or similar field with an emphasis toward applied behavioral health practices. It is preferred that this course be taught on campus, but it may be moved to online, if necessary. The course to be taught in Fall 2021 is as follows:

ABH100 – Introduction to Applied Behavioral Health (3) This course will introduce students to the scientific study of human behavior and cognition as an individual and as a person in the environment. A community learning component will be required in order to expose the student to the practical aspects of this discipline with behavioral health agencies and the responsibilities of a person employed in these settings.

Minimum Requirements:

Master's degree (degree plus 18 graduate hours) or Ph.D. degree in the study of human behavior, behavioral health or similar field with an emphasis toward applied behavioral health practices. Must be prepared to teach online learning using the Canvas platform. Must be authorized for unrestricted employment in the United States indefinitely with no immigration sponsorship needed.

Working Conditions:

Office and classroom environment with minimum lifting (25 pounds) required.
