

2021-2022: V1 Independent Student Standard Verification Worksheet

Your 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information, we will compare your FAFSA with the information on this institutional verification document and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this institutional verification document, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the Student Financial Services Department. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact us as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

C. Independent Student's Income Information

- The student or spouse filed separate IRS income tax returns for 2019 or had a change in marital status after December 31, 2019;
 - The student or spouse filed or will file an amended 2019 IRS tax return;
 - The student or spouse is a victim of IRS tax-related identity theft; or
 - The student or spouse filed non-IRS income tax return (i.e. a tax filer who filed in income tax return with Guam, The Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, or a foreign tax authority).

- Get Transcript ONLINE - Go to www.irs.gov, under the Tools heading, click "Get a tax transcript." Click "Get Transcript ONLINE." Make sure to request the "IRS Tax Return Transcript" and **NOT** the "IRS Tax Account Transcript."

- Paper Request Form - IRS Form 4506T-EZ or IRS Form 4506-T

In most cases, for electronic tax return filers, 2019 IRS income tax return information is available for the IRS DRT or the IRS Tax Return Transcript within 2–3 weeks after the 2019 electronic IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS. Generally, for filers of 2019 paper IRS income tax returns, the 2019 IRS income tax return information is available for the IRS DRT or the IRS Tax Return Transcript within 6-8 weeks after the 2019 paper IRS income tax return has been received by the IRS. Contact the Student Financial Services Department if more information is needed about using the IRS DRT or obtaining an IRS Tax Return Transcript.

If the student and spouse filed separate 2019 IRS income tax returns, the IRS DRT cannot be used and the **2019 IRS Tax Return Transcript(s)** must be provided for each.
