HISTORY OF ANDREW COLLEGE

- 1854 Andrew Female College founded and named for Bishop James O. Andrew
- 1856 Inaugural Andrew College graduation
- 1863 On-campus classes suspended at the behest of Confederate troops during the Civil War; campus facilities temporarily become Hood Hospital
- 1870 First edition of the *Andrew College Bell* is published; sold for \$0.25 per copy
- 1882 Eudora Hamilton serves as president of the College, the first female president in Andrew College history
- 1892 Campus burns to the ground but is rebuilt with the help of local citizens
- 1912 Andrew Female College becomes Andrew College
- 1917 Andrew Female College becomes a two-year school
- 1953 Theta Lambda chapter of Phi Theta Kappa chartered
- 1954 Andrew College celebrates 100 years of service in Southwest Georgia
- 1956 Andrew College transitions to coeducational education
- 1992 Men's soccer team appears in NJCAA National Championship
- 1997 AndrewServes Servant Leadership Program chartered
- 2002 Dedication of Phyllis and Jack Jones Chapel
- 2004 Andrew College celebrates 150 years of service
- 2009 Pai Chai University in Daejeon, South Korea, becomes a sister school
- 2014 Andrew College celebrates 160 years of service in Southwest Georgia
- 2015 Dr. Linda R. Buchanan becomes the 28th president and the second female president in Andrew College history
- 2016 Andrew College establishes an associate of science degree in sustainable agriculture
- 2017 Andrew College establishes a bachelor of science degree in business administration (BSBA), an associate degree in nursing (ADN), an associate of science degree in timber management and an online cancer registry certificate program
- 2019 Andrew College establishes an associate of science degree in respiratory therapy

AMANDA KNIGHT, M.Ed.

Amanda Knight has taught at Andrew College since 1999, making this her twenty-third year here and earning her the title of the Faculty Marshal. She holds the rank of tenured Professor of English and currently serves as the Coordinator of Program Development and Accreditation. Among her many honors and awards, Professor Knight has been elected Faculty Chair twice, served as the Chair of the Educational Program Committee for many years, received the Governor's Teaching Fellows Award through the University of Georgia (2017-18) and the Exemplary Teacher Award through the United Methodist General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (2016). She was awarded a USDE Fulbright-Hays GPA Grant to lead a faculty study group to South Korea and China (2010) and to participate in a USDE Fulbright-Hays GPA Grant faculty study group to Lithuania, Latvia, and Russia (2004). She has served as the Faculty Representative to the Board of Trustees (2005-06) and was named Phi Theta Kappa Faculty Scholar (2005). During her thirteen years as a high school English teacher, she was named STAR Teacher twice, 1991-1992 and 1994-1995. In 2007, she published a textbook entitled *Punctuation Decoded*, available through Kendall Hunt Publishers or on Amazon.

Professor Knight earned her Bachelor of Science in Education from Valdosta State University and her Master of Education from Georgia Southwestern State University.

Nowadays she works on establishing new programs at Andrew College, teaching a class or two, staying abreast of the college's accreditation requirements, and helping her fellow faculty members. When not working, Amanda enjoys traveling, playing with her dog (Maggie), cooking, gardening, and singing in the Dawson UMC choir. She and her husband David have a daughter, Rachel, who is an Andrew College alumna (Class of 2010).

THE GONFALONS

Gonfalons, a flag that hangs from a crosspiece or frame, originated in the medieval republics of Italy as a banner of state or office. Academic gonfalons have been adopted in many colleges and universities around the world as institutional insignias. In 1984, Allene Boyett made the first gonfalons for Andrew College. Each Academic Division of the College has its distinctive gonfalon, which is displayed on formal occasions.



THE ORIGIN OF THE MACE

The origin of the mace dates back to medieval times when it was first used as a weapon. By the 16th century, the mace, a symbol of authority, was embraced as a ceremonial object by European colleges and universities. Traditionally, the mace is carried by the Grand Marshal during formal academic occasions.

During President Billy Greer's administration, 1980-1985, the first mace was made in 1984 by John Gary. Years later, this mace was replaced with the modern one that is carried in today's ceremony. The senior faculty member always serves as the Faculty Marshal and carries the mace whenever the faculty march in regalia.
