Minimum Requirements:

- Doctorate or Master's degree in mathematics or a related field or a graduate degree and 18 hours in mathematics from an accredited institution
- Three to five years teaching experience preferred.

Office and classroom environment with minimum lifting (25 pounds) required.

Flexible teaching and office hours that may include late afternoons, early evenings, weekends.
